Areas of Interest - SIP

- ❖ **Reading & Math SMART Goals** – The percent of students in all grades that take the MCA and achieve the level of “Meets the Standard or Exceeds the Standard” in reading and math will increase.
- ❖ **Climate SMART Goals** – The number of students with 90% or higher attendance will increase by 35% and the number of students suspended will decrease by 50% this school year.
- ❖ **Professional Development Strategies to support reading, math, and climate**
– We have reading and math specialist teachers that provide additional support to our students. They use intervention curriculum, collaborate/coaching with core teachers and being apart of staff development that enhances and increases the effectiveness of the reading and math workshops.

- We engage and communicate with parents through parent involvement events, newsletter, robo calls, and now text message. We have partner programs like Check and Connect that help with increasing attendance with our struggling students. Along with our Student Advocate Team that helps to decrease behavior issues.
- ❖ **Family Involvement Strategies to support reading and math** – Teachers provide parents with frequent and thorough progress reports, via parent portal. Parents provide ideas for how to support math and reading at home during conferences and collaborative school site council meetings.
